

ANNEXURE B – FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS FOR GROUP MEMBERS

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2.	Am I eligible if I did not suffer any financial loss?
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1. Am I a group member?

A group member in the WiseTech Shareholder Class Action is a person or entity who, during the period from 21 August 2019 to 27 May 2020 (inclusive) (**Claim Period**), either acquired:

- (a) an interest in ordinary shares in WiseTech Global Limited (ASX:WTC) (**WiseTech shares**); or
- (b) long exposure to WiseTech shares by entering into equity swap confirmations in respect of WiseTech shares, and who is alleged to have suffered loss or damage by or resulting from WiseTech's alleged contravening conduct.

You are not eligible to participate if you are:

- (a) a director, officer, close associate, related party, related body corporate, or associated entity of WiseTech; or
- (b) a Justice, Registrar, Judicial Registrar, District Registrar, or Deputy District Registrar of the High Court of Australia or the Chief Justice, a Justice, Associate Justice or Judicial Registrar of the Supreme Court of Victoria.

If you are a current or former WiseTech employee, you are a group member if you acquired WiseTech shares during the Claim Period and you have not been, at any time from 21 August 2019:

- (a) a director or company secretary of WiseTech;
- (b) a person who makes, or participates in making, decisions that affect the whole, or a substantial part, of the business of WiseTech, or who has the capacity to affect significantly WiseTech's financial standing, or a person in accordance with whose instructions or wishes the directors of the WiseTech are accustomed to act; or
- (c) a director or company secretary of a related body corporate of WiseTech.

Please note that the plaintiff and our firm do not have a list of group members. You received the email from WiseTech's share registry provider, MUFG Corporate Markets (AU) Limited, containing a link to the opt out and registration notice because your email address was recorded on the share register.

2. Am I eligible if I did not suffer any financial loss?

As the determination of loss or damage is a matter for expert evidence and the Court, group members do not need to establish loss or damage at this stage of the proceeding to participate.

If you acquired an interest in WiseTech shares, or equity swaps in respect of WiseTech shares, during the Claim Period, you should still register even if you believe you did not suffer any financial loss.

3. I have not sold my shares. Am I a group member?

Yes, if you acquired the shares during the Claim Period. You do not need to have sold your shares to be a group member.

4. I have sold my shares. Am I a group member?

Yes, if you acquired the shares during the Claim Period. You do not need to have retained your shares to be a group member.

5. Am I eligible if I received shares through a dividend reinvestment plan (DRP)?

You are still eligible if you received shares through a dividend reinvestment plan, so long as you acquired those shares during the Claim Period.

6. What do I do if the group member has passed away? / My late family member bought shares; do they have a claim?

The executor or administrator of the estate of the deceased group member may elect to register on behalf of the estate via the Group Member Registration Form available at <https://phifinney-mcdonald.com/action/wisetech-shareholder-class-action/>

7. My shares were bequeathed to me. Am I a group member?

If your only interest in WiseTech shares was because the shares were inherited or gifted to you, you are not a group member. This is because you did not pay money or other consideration in order to acquire or purchase the interest in those shares and therefore cannot establish that you suffered loss or damage by paying too much for those shares.

8. Why do I need to register?

If you wish to obtain any benefit arising from any settlement reached between the parties at the Court-ordered mediation (to take place by 7 December 2026) or before two weeks prior to the first day of the initial trial in the proceeding, you must register your participation in the WiseTech Shareholder Class Action.

If you previously registered your interest with Phi Finney McDonald, you are deemed to be a group member and do not need to register, but you may be contacted by one of our team to ensure that we have received all the information needed to complete your registration.

9. What is the registration deadline?

You must register your participation in the WiseTech Shareholder Class Action by **4:00pm AEST on 3 July 2026**.

10. How do I register?

To register your participation in the WiseTech Shareholder Class Action, please complete the Group Member Registration Form available at <https://phifinneymcdonald.com/action/wisetech-shareholder-class-action/>

Alternatively, you can register by completing and submitting the Registration Form in the form of Schedule 1 to the Notice by email to wisetechshareholders@phifinneymcdonald.com or by post to Phi Finney McDonald, Suite 2, Level 24, 500 Bourke Street, Melbourne, Victoria, 3000.

11. How can I confirm registration?

Once you have completed and submitted the Group Member Registration Form, a message should appear in your browser confirming that the submission has been accepted. If you do not see the confirmation, please re-submit the information. You **will not** receive a separate email notifying you that your registration has been accepted.

12. I need to register multiple claims on behalf of several claimants. What should I do?

If you are authorised to act on behalf of more than one WiseTech security holder or person with a beneficial interest, please complete and submit the Group Member Registration Form separately for each. You should receive a separate on-screen confirmation of submission for each claim registered (see question 11 above).

13. Does it cost anything to register and participate?

There is no out-of-pocket cost to register to participate in the WiseTech Shareholder Class Action.

If the class action does not result in a judgment or settlement payable by WiseTech, you will not be liable to pay any amount.

If the class action does result in a judgment or settlement payable by WiseTech, then under the terms of the Group Costs Order approved by the Supreme Court of Victoria, the lawyers in the proceeding will receive 35% of any judgment or settlement. The Court has the power to vary this percentage at any time to ensure that justice is done in the proceeding.

14. What are the legal implications of registering?

If you register for the WiseTech Shareholder Class Action, you may be eligible to receive compensation as part of any settlement reached prior to two weeks before the commencement of the initial trial (provided that it is approved by the Court and you satisfy any eligibility requirements).

You will be bound by any resolution of the class action. This means you will not be permitted to bring any overlapping claims related to the subject matter litigated in the WiseTech Shareholder Class Action.

15. What happens if I do not respond to the Opt Out and Registration Notice?

If you do not register or opt out of the class action, you will not be able to participate in any settlement reached at the Court-ordered mediation or before two weeks prior to the first day of the initial trial.

As an unregistered member, you are still bound by the terms of any Court-approved settlement, including any releases. However, you will not have the right to bring a claim against WiseTech for matters related to those litigated in the WiseTech Shareholder Class Action.

If there is no settlement, you will be entitled to compensation ordered by the Court if it finds in favour of the plaintiff and group members, you satisfy any eligibility criteria for compensation, and you register by any subsequent deadline.

If the WiseTech Shareholder Class Action is unsuccessful, you will not be able to bring a claim in another proceeding against WiseTech unless you have opted out of this proceeding before the deadline of **4:00pm AEST on 3 July 2026**.

16. I wish to opt out.

If you do not want to remain a group member in the WiseTech Shareholder Class Action, you can opt out by the Class Deadline, which is **4:00pm AEST on 3 July 2026**.

You can opt out of the proceeding by completing the Opt Out Form at the end of the Notice that you will have received, or by filling in an Online Opt Out.

If you choose to opt out, Opt Out Forms must be returned directly to the Commercial Court Registry of the Supreme Court of Victoria:

Do not send your Opt Out Form to Phi Finney McDonald.

17. What happens if I opt out?

If you choose to opt out of the class action after the Class Deadline:

- (a) you will no longer be a group member in the WiseTech Shareholder Class Action;
- (b) you will not be entitled to any benefit that ultimately is obtained on behalf of group members in the WiseTech Shareholder Class Action, whether by way of settlement or Court judgment; and
- (c) you will preserve your right to pursue a separate claim against WiseTech in relation to the matters the subject of the WiseTech Shareholder Class Action, if you so choose; however
- (d) because there are time limits in which to commence proceedings to recover any loss and damage you may have suffered, if you wish to pursue a separate claim against WiseTech, you should seek legal advice as soon as possible regarding the amount of time available to you in which to commence a proceeding.

18. Will I be entitled to compensation, and if so, how much?

It is too early to answer this question. If the class action results in a judgment, your entitlement to compensation will be determined by the Court. If the class action is settled, your entitlement will be determined as part of the settlement approved by the Court.

19. I want to change the details I gave when I registered, how can I update my records?

Please send an email to wisetechshareholders@phifinney-mcdonald.com detailing any changes to your registration information. Please ensure the name of the claimant is included in the subject line of the email.

20. I can't meet the Registration Deadline.

If you do not register your interest before the Class Deadline of **4:00 pm AEST on 3 July 2026** you will not be permitted to participate in any settlement of the WiseTech Shareholder Class Action reached before two weeks before the first day of the initial trial in the proceeding, without leave of the Court.

21. What is my HIN / SRN?

A Holder Identification Number (HIN) is a unique number that identifies you as a CHESSE sponsored shareholder with a broker. A HIN usually starts with the letter "X" followed by ten numbers (e.g. X0001234567).

A Security Holder Reference Number (SRN) is used to identify the owner of shares that are held by a share registry (i.e., the shares are issuer sponsored).

You can find the HIN/SRN number on your trade confirmation statement. It will either be 10 or 11 characters in length. If it is 11 characters in length, the HIN or SRN begins with the letter i, n or x. The remaining 10 characters are numbers. For example, i0012345678, n0012345678, x0012345678.

If you have not retained your holding statement(s), you can request this number from your financial advisor, stockbroker, CHESSE Sponsor, Issuer Sponsor, or WiseTech's share registry which is managed by MUFG Corporate Markets (AU) Limited.

22. Where can I find details of my holdings if I can't find my contract notes?

You can request confirmation of your holdings from WiseTech's share registry, MUFG Corporate Markets (AU) Limited. PFM does not have access to this information.

23. I am experiencing issues registering.

24. My question has not been answered. Can I speak to a lawyer?

Because of the large number of shareholders who would have received the Opt Out & Registration Notice, we cannot guarantee a timely response to a telephone enquiry. If you have a question that is not addressed above, please email wisetechshareholders@phifinney-mcdonald.com. You are also welcome to seek independent advice from another lawyer.

25. What do you do with my details / data once I register?
